Condition Report

1661. Old Age, man - right hand damaged and reglued, crutch stick restored, 2 chips to rim of base, heavy wear to painted decoration.

Old Age, woman - chip to nose, 2 chips to rim of base, lacking handle of basket, minor wear to painted decoration.

Age - chip to nose, repair to handle of basket, lacking end of walking stick, several chips around footrim. Pastime - large chip to rim of base, lady's body is resorred as is the bocage.

Return - numerous losses, areas of restoration and damage.

Shepherd and Shepherdess - lady lacking left arm, lacking flute, numerous small losses and damage.
