1149. Generally good clean condition. Well hollowed and nice quality carving. No significant damage or repairs. Few very minor nicks to rim and highpoints, but nothing of any real significance. Small minor 3mm white hairline inclusion to rim. Minor scuffs and scratches to base. Good uniform colour to stone. No cover or stand. Weight 452g.
