A Chinese Imari porcelain teapot and cover, Kangxi period, of octagonal baluster form, painted and gilt with panels of flowers, height 8.7cm, together with a similar blue and white teapot and cover with plated mounts, the body painted with figures and flowers, height 11.3cm (cover repaired). Provenance: from the private collection of David Armitage, former conservator to the Department of Eastern Art at the Ashmolean Museum, Oxford, between 1970 and 1999.

Condition Report

1007. Imari teapot - small impact hole to one facet of body and hairlines running off. Otherwise generally good condition with typical light surface scratches and wear. Typical minor glaze fritting to rim of cover.

Blue and white teapot - cover has been repaired and fitted with a plated rim. Otherwise the body is in good condition with no significant damage or repairs and typical minor surface scratches and wear. Also fitted with a plated rim.
