A Chinese blue and white export porcelain bowl, mark and period of Kangxi, of steep-sided circular form with slightly flared rim, the exterior painted with fruiting vine, underglaze blue six-character mark within double ring to base, height 10.7cm, diameter 22.3cm (extensively damaged, repaired and some losses to rim), with a carved hardwood stand. Provenance: from the private collection of David Armitage, former conservator to the Department of Eastern Art at the Ashmolean Museum, Oxford, between 1970 and 1999.

1135. The bowl has been broken into ten pieces and reglued, as can be seen in the images on our website there are a number of missing pieces to the rim and footrim. Signs of rivet repairs in the past. Extensive restoration required.
