A group of eleven Chinese porcelain teabowls/cups, 18th century and later, including a famille rose Batavian ware bowl, decorated with peaches and flowers (hairline to rim), diameter 6.4cm, a doucai bowl, mark of Chenghua but later, painted with blossoming and fruiting branches, diameter 7cm (chip to rim), a pair of white on coral ground wax resist decorated beakers, height 5.9cm (one cracked and chipped), five famille rose bowls and a small blue and white bowl (some with faults).

Estimate: £80 - £120

Condition Report

1056. Batavian bowl - small chip and two hairlines to rim, typical wear.

Pair of iron red bowls - one with chip to rim and two vertical cracks, other in generally good condition, both with typical surface scratches and wear.

Famille rose figural bowl - good condition, typical wear to gilt and enamels.

Doucai bowl - two chips and hairline to rim, otherwise ok.

Blue and white bowl - good condition, no chips, cracks or repairs.

3 famille rose bowl - one with hairline crack, other two in generally good condition, typical light wear and surface scratches, one with minor firing blemish to rim.

Famille rose bowl - cracked and misfired.

Famille rose bowl - star crack to base, otherwise good condition.
