A late Victorian silver four-piece tea set of half-reeded cushion form, embossed with bands of flowers and scrolling leaves, on ball feet, comprising teapot, hot water pot, two-handled sugar bowl and milk jug, Sheffield 1895 and 1896 by James Dixon & Sons Ltd, total weight 2013.2g, height of hot water pot 23.5cm, within an original fitted oak travelling box, together with a plated two-handled tea tray with gadrooned rim, length 67.5cm. Note: a non-transferrable ivory exemption certificate has been granted for the sale of this item.

Condition Report

330. All pieces engraved with initials. All a little dirty and would benefit from a clean.

Teapot - generally good condition. Hinge lid gapes everso slightly. Typical light surface scratches and wear. Good clear hallmarks.

Hot water pot - small dent to rim, otherwise generally good condition with typical light surface scratches and wear. Good clear marks.

Milk jug and sugar bowl - both in good condition, typical light surface scratches and wear. Good clear marks.

Plated tray in good order, typical light surface scratches.

Oak box is structurally sound, but exterior and interior a bit tatty.
