A late 19th/early 20th century French brass cased petite sonnerie alarm carriage clock by Henri Jacot, with eight day movement striking quarters and repeating on two gongs, the backplate with stamped maker's mark and numbered '18609', the white enameled dial with black Roman hour numerals, outer Arabic minutes and subsidiary alarm dial, the corniche case with swing handle and bevelled glass panels, on bracket feet, the underside with three lever selection for 'Full Striking', 'Silent' and 'Quarters', height 18.4cm, with leather mounted travelling case and original numbered winding key.

Estimate: £200 - £400

Condition Report

1210. The case is a bit dusty and dirty so would certainly benefit from a clean. Typical light surface scratches. Glass panels in good condition. Bottom securing pin to back door is missing, so back door is loose. Dial has hairline cracks and chip to centre.

Both trains wind smoothly and the movement is running, strike mechanism and repeat also in good working order, but please be aware we give no guarantees to working order or reliability of any clock or watch.

Outer carry case is worn with some loss to covering and missing handle.

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
