LOT 1260

An 18th century ebonized bracket clock, the five pillar single fusee movement with verge escapement and pull quarter repeat on two bells and striking hours on a larger bell, the backplate with finely engraved foliate scrolls, the 6-inch brass breakarch dial with silvered chapter ring framing a matt centre with mock pendulum aperture and date aperture, below a silvered circular boss to the arch, inscribed 'Ellicot London', all cornered with cast and pierced gilt spandrels, the case with bell top and brass carry handle above glazed sides, front and back doors, on a moulded rectangular plinth base, height 45.8cm, with case key and engraved winding key.

Estimate: £1,800 - £2,400

Condition Report

1260. The clock is in generally good restored condition.

Case with typical scuffs, scratches, nicks and wear. All glass panels in good order. It has obviously been restored in the not too distant past and the case and movement are very clean, but we do not have any further details of this.

Dial is in good condition.

Movement is in good order, winds smoothly and runs but please be aware we give no guarantees to working order or reliability of any clock or watch.

The pull quarter repeat strikes on the larger bell and then on the two smaller bells and appears to be in good working order. It does not strike on the hour.
