A George III mahogany bracket clock with eight day twin fusee movement striking hours on a bell with pull repeat mechanism, the 8-inch painted circular convex dial with black Roman hour numerals and inscribed 'James Reid London', the case with moulded arch pediment and pad top with brass carrying handle, above pierced brass fret panels to front and glazed panels to sides, on a moulded plinth base and brass bracket feet, height 42.6cm, with pendulum, two case keys and winding key. Note: James Reid is a recorded London clockmaker working in Ball Alley pre-1789 to 1824.

Condition Report

1265. The clock is in generally good cosmetic condition with no significant damage or repairs. Typical light surface scratches, scuffs and wear to case commensurate with age. Typical minor veneer splits to arch top, sides and back door. Few minor veneer restorations. Both hinged doors are good. Both trains of movement wind smoothly, and the hour striking and repeat striking mechanisms also in working order, but please be aware we give no guarantees to working order or reliability of any clock or watch.

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
