### LOT 1496

A mixed group of New Hall Boy and the Butterfly teawares, pattern No. 421, late 18th/early 19th century, comprising coffee pot and cover, three different shaped teapots and covers, sucrier and cover, three jugs, two plates, two oval shaped teapot stands and a lobed example, sugar bowl, slop bowl, three coffee cans, four teacups, twelve teabowls and sixteen saucers (faults and restoration).

Estimate: £80 - £120

### Condition Report

Coffee pot and cover - cover professionally restored, 2 faint starcracks to base underside.

Ogee shaped teapot and cover - starcrack to main body, cover ok.

Boat shaped teapot and cover - small chip to foot, decoration overall very worn/rubbed.

Silver shaped teapot and cover - in good condition overall.

Sucrier and cover - extensive cracks to main body, chipping and staining to flange where cover sits, chip to underside rim edge of cover, details of decoration rubbed.

Lobed shape jug - badly pitted/marked paste since manufacture, decoration rubbed.

Two fluted jugs - pattern 431 in good condition overall with light rubbing to rim interior, pattern 421 heavily worn.

Slop bowl - Vertical firing crack to rim, otherwise ok.

Sugar bowl - starcracks to base, heavily worn interior.

2 large saucer dishes - one generally ok, other heavily pitted with scratched surface.

3 cans - 1 generally ok, 2 with minor faults.

4 teacups - each generally ok with varying degrees of wear.

12 teabowls - of varying size, with minor faults, others generally ok but with varying degrees of wear to decoration.

16 saucers - 9 in good condition overall with no issues or faults, 6 with minor faults, one crazed.

2 oval teapot stands - one badly chipped and worn, other with haircracks

Shaped teapot stand - light scratches/surface wear but generally ok.
