### LOT 1548

A pair of Derby porcelain pointer dogs, circa 1830-40, each with liver markings, on blue glazed bases with gilt enriched scroll moulded edges, length 12.5cm (both restored), together with a mixed group of Staffordshire figures and dogs, including a white and gilt group, titled 'Eugenie & Napoleon', a Highland huntsman and two spill vase groups, modelled as a swan swimming beneath a bridge surmounted by a young girl, height 22cm, a Coalport Staffordshire style house and a pink lustre decorated jug (faults and restoration).

Estimate: £100 - £200

### Condition Report

Pair Derby dogs - both are heavily restored with old yellowed restoration, and then with more damage since, including cracks and chips.

Spill vase group with horse and cow drinking from trough - some minor restoration.

Large Highland Huntsman - restored leg.

Large spill vase group with Highland musicians - heavily and extensively restored.

Medium sized spill vase group with two highland figures and dog - extensively crazed and stained.

Green arbour group with two figures - minor restoration.

Two figures with dog on kennel - reproduction.

Large white arbour group with two standing males - arbour repaired.

London 30 Miles group - heavily and extensively poorly restored.

Small copper lustre dogs - facing right cracked.

Small iron red dog - neck repaired.

Pair iron red dogs - heavily crazed.

Pair black and white dogs - facing right cracked.

Pair white dogs - both cracked and heavily worn.

Umbrella House - roof cracked.

House pastille burner - extensively and heavily restored.

Jug - heavily crazed.

Remaining items in lot in good condition overall with typical crazing.
