A large Chinese blue and white export porcelain jar and domed cover, Kangxi period, of baluster form, the body painted with a band of blue-ground lappet and ruyi-head panels filled with peony and scrolling leafy tendrils, the short neck similarly filled with lotus and tendrils, height 58cm (crack to neck and lacking finial).

Estimate: £1,500 - £2,000

Condition Report

1080. Small chip to rim and then a hairline crack which starts from the chip and runs down the neck and on to the shoulder (approx 14cm), the hairline then veers to the left (almost at right angles) and runs horizontally across the body (approx 20cm), just below this there is a small star crack, but it is only visible to the glaze of the interior, it does not appear to have come through on the exterior.

Otherwise the body appears to be in generally good order with no other significant damage. Typical wear and minor fritting to glaze on rim and typical light surface scratches to glaze.

Cover has broken and missing finial, otherwise in generally good condition with small chip to underside of rim and typical minor glaze fritting to rim.
