A Chinese blanc-de-Chine porcelain gu beaker vase, probably early 18th century, of flared cylindrical form, the neck applied with eight shou characters above a raised central band of the eight trigrams (Bagua), the lower section with blossoming prunus branches, height 24.8cm (minor faults). Note: for a similarly decorated beaker vase, see plate 53 of P.J. Donnelly's 'Blanc de Chine', 1969.

### Condition Report

1060. Generally good condition with no cracks or repairs. Small chip to edge of base (see web image). Typical light surface scratches to glaze. Some glaze blemishes to interior and exterior. Decoration in generally good crisp order. One prunus petal is chipped.
