A Nymphenburg porcelain ovoid tea caddy, circa 1763-1765, painted with opposing floral sprays and scattered sprigs beneath a gilt dentil band, rare underglaze blue hexagram mark to base, height 9.3cm (lacking cover), together with a Vienna porcelain coffee pot and cover, second half 18th century, painted with flowers, underglaze blue shield mark to base, height 23cm.

Condition Report

Updated - 28/02/24

Tea caddy is in good condition with no chips, cracks or restoration. Lacking cover.

Coffee pot has a few small chips to the internal rim of the lid and a small graze to the edge of the rim. The spout of the coffee pot is completely restored. The main body does seem to 'ring' when tapped.
