### LOT 1430

A French faience bough pot, 19th century, of typical 'D' shape, painted in manganese, blue, yellow and green with flowers, the top with one large aperture and an arrangement of smaller holes, length at widest point 23cm, together with a two-handled Delft posset pot, a three-footed maiolica salt and a blue painted faience jar with matched cover, height 10cm (minor faults).

Estimate: £70 - £100

### Condition Report

1430. Bough pot - hairline crack to edge of large aperture, couple of chips to footrim and top rim, some minor losses to the glaze in other places.

Salt - hairline cracked, chipping to rim and feet with losses to glaze.

Faience jar and cover - cover with chip to underside of rim. Jar with hairline cracks to rim, small chip to foot, nibbles to glaze on rim.

Two-handled posset - a couple of chips to rim, noticeable losses to glaze on edges, handles and footrim. Star crack to base.
