A pair of cranberry tinted craquelure ice glass vases, mid to late 19th century, of high-shouldered form, gilt with a band of fruiting vine, height 23cm, together with a large group of flint ice glassware with gilt details, including a large jug with fruiting vine band, height 33cm, glasses, decanters, a carafe, jugs and a jug with ice compartment and entwined reeded handle, height 27.5cm (some faults). Provenance: from the collection of John and Poppy Stallebrass.

Condition Report

1821. Pair tinted cranberry - heavy wear to gilding, one with small impact crack to the surface on the shoulder, a few nibbles to the body.

Pair of clear slender decanters - both stoppers chipped, one with chip to rim, heavy wear to gilt decoration.

Goblets - one with chip to rim.

Globular decanter - lacking stopper, nibble to rim.

Lobed slender decanter - stopper badly chipped, decanter with nibbles to rim, heavy wear to gilt.

Banded jug - heavy wear to gilt.

Ogee bowled goblet - heavy wear to gilt.

Lobed footed tazza - nibbles to rim of bowl, wear to gilt.

Other pieces in fair condition, typical wear to craquelure with nick and nibbles amongst the decoration, majority with some degree of gilding loss, some quite large.
