LOT 1859

A large mixed group of mostly Stourbridge air trap satin glassware, late 19th century, including vases, jugs and beakers, predominantly with a quilted diamond design but also chevrons and spots, in blue, pink, yellow and caramel colours, height of tallest pair 32.5cm (minor faults). Provenance: from the collection of John and Poppy Stallebrass.

Estimate: £100 - £150

Condition Report

1859. 19 with noticeable minor faults:

3 tallest pink vases, pair of blue bottle vases - minor nibbles to rims

Snake detailed neck - chipped rim

Two-tone pink vase - impact crack, flat in nature, diameter approx 1mm

Blue flared vase - flat chip to one side, discoloured

Purple handled - internal cracking on one side

Orange handled - chipping to handle terminal

Lighter orange handled - chip to handle terminal

Squat yellow vase, small slender yellow vase - chipping to rim

Bottle orange/pink vase - cracks to nick

Three blue vases - minor nibbles to rim

Globular flared pink vase - large flat chip to foot

Similar globular flared pink vase - chip to rim

All others in fairly good condition, with some light scratching to interiors, slight scuffing to exteriors.
