### LOT 1840

A large mixed group of cranberry tinted craquelure ice glassware, mostly mid to late 19th century, including an epergne with central trumpet, height 47cm, an ice bucket with plated rim, a decanter bottle with engraved fruiting vine band, jugs, beakers and a leaf shaped dish, together with a small group of green, blue and yellow ice glassware (minor faults). Provenance: from the collection of John and Poppy Stallebrass.

Estimate: £100 - £150

### Condition Report

1840. Green bowls - each with a few nibbles to rims.

Large blue jug - chip to handle

One blue jug with yellow handle - chip to spout

Other blue jug - staining to interior

Oval red dish - nick to rim

Leaf dish - chip to underside of rim

Circular dish - chip to underside of rim

Pink pot and cover - nibbles to rim of pot

Red pot and cover - cover with large chips to rim

Red tinted glass - chip to bowl rim

Globular vase - restoration to rim

One red jug - chip to rim

Another red jug - cracked handle

Large globular jug - cracked to body by handle

Slender decanter - lacking stopper

Bucket - impact crack/bruise to surface on one side

All other pieces in fairly good condition, typical scuffing/nibbling to craquelure overall.
