### LOT 1645

A set of five Caughley Apple and Damsons blue printed teabowls and saucers, circa 1780, unmarked, diameter of saucers 12.5cm, together with a mixed group of other porcelain and pottery, including an ironstone part service and two pearlware plates (faults).

Estimate: £70 - £100

### Condition Report

1645. Five teabowls - good condition, no chips, cracks or repairs.

2 saucers are cracked, other 3 ok, but minor glaze flakes/chips to rims, all with typical surface scratches and wear.

Spiral fluted teabowl - ok, saucer badly worn.

2 blue and white pearlware plates - both crazed with some staining, larger plate with small rim chip.

Blue and white basket - broken in half and re-glued.

Blue and white leaf dish - chip to footrim and crazed.

Ironstone plates - one plate with chip and crack to rim, larger meatplate with crack, other pieces in good condition with no chips, cracks or repairs. Typical light surface scratches and wear to decoration.
