A C.J. Mason relief moulded ironstone cup and saucer, early 19th century, painted with reserved chinoiserie panels against an orange basketweave moulded ground, indistinct impressed mark to cup, together with a Berlin porcelain triangular shaped dish, painted with a bird, and a small group of other ceramics (faults).

Estimate: £50 - £70

Condition Report

Mason cup and saucer - in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration, some typical light wear to the gilding and enamelling.

Berlin dish - minor rubbing to gilt rim, otherwise in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration.

Continental cherub - pseudo gold painted anchor mark to base, in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration.

Derby cherub - missing both arms and basket which would have been attached to tummy. Some losses/chips to flowers and foliage.

3 Staffordshire houses - burgundy coloured walls example is a reproduction, the other two are both quite late Staffordshire, each in good condition.

Pair vases - first with approx 4cm long vertical haircrack to top rim edge by left handle, otherwise ok. Second heavily crazed and stained overall with glued repair to top rim edge and a vertical haircrack to top rim edge approx 3cm long.
