LOT 1283

A mid-19th century French brown patinated bronze and ormolu cased mantel clock, the eight day movement with silk suspension, striking hours and half hours on a bell via an outside countwheel, the silvered circular dial within a cast gilt vine surround, the case with dog and child surmount, on a rectangular base with cast foliate scroll decoration, height 43.5cm, with pendulum and winding key, on a rosewood oval stand (some faults and lacking glass dome).

Condition Report

1283. Clock is dusty and dirty but in generally ok condition, apart from repaired and detached pieces of leaf section surmount. Otherwise typical surface scratches and wear to bronze and ormolu. Dial is worn. Both barrels of movement wind smoothly and it starts to run but only for a couple of minutes of so. Strike mechanism is working. The movement is quite dirty so it may just require a service/clean but we cannot confirm this.

Rosewood stand has some veneer splits, minor repairs, chips, scuffs and wear. Some minor shrinkage cracks and chips to feet.
