A late 19th century French gilt lacquered brass cased diminutive carriage clock by Drocourt, the eight day movement striking hours and half hours and repeating on a gong, the backplate with stamped maker's mark and numbered '19677', the enamelled dial with turquoise hour plaques and black Roman numerals, within a gilt and blue border, the gorge case with swing handle and bevelled glass panels, height 12.8cm, with winding key.

Estimate: £400 - £600

Condition Report

1250. Case in generally good condition. Typical light surface scratches, but no significant damage or repairs. All glass panels in good condition. Dial with faint diagonal hairline to top right corner otherwise in good order. The movement winds and adjusts smoothly, strike and repeat mechanism working as it should and the clock is currently running, but please be aware we give no guarantees to working order or reliability of any clock or watch.

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
