LOT 1087

A group of five Chinese famille verte powder blue ground porcelain plates, Kangxi period, each central octalobed panel filled with either a bird or butterflies beside blossoming branches, surrounded by smaller flower-filled vignettes to rim, all reserved against a powder blue ground with gilt decoration, diameters 21.9cm to 22.2cm (faults).

Condition Report

1087. Plate 1 - 3.5cm hairline to rim, few minor chips/nicks to rim, otherwise generally good condition with typical light surface scratches and wear to enamels and glaze. Some rubbing to gilt. Good vibrant colours
Plate 2 - 'V' shaped section of rim broken out in two places and reglued (8.5cm wide and 2.5cm at deepest point). Minor nicks to rim. Significant wear to gilt. Typical light surface scratches and wear to glaze and enamels, otherwise good vibrant colours.

Plate 3 - broken in half and reglued, minor nicks/chips to rim, significant wear to gilt, typical light surface scratches and wear to enamels and glaze, otherwise good vibrant colours.

Plate 4 - 5.5cm faint hairline crack to rim, a minor chip to rim, otherwise generally good condition with no repairs, minor wear to gilt and typical light surface scratches and wear to glaze and enamels, good vibrant decoration.

Plate 5 - broken out section of rim (7cm x 2.5cm) which has been amateurly reglued, numerous small chips to rim, faint 3cm hairline to rim, typical light surface scratches and wear to glaze and enamels, some wear to gilt, good vibrant colours.
