A Japanese Kakiemon porcelain circular dish, Edo period, circa 1700, the centre painted in underglaze blue with figures, boats and pavilions in a river landscape, framed by a double ring and rock border, within a brightly enamelled and gilt border of flowers and pomegranates, diameter 25.2cm (hairline crack to rim).
