A Japanese cloisonné jar, Meiji period, decorated with opposing panels of eagle and geese, reserved against a simulated brocade ground, mounted with a French gilt metal stand and fitted with a pierced hardwood dome cover, total height 32.3cm, together with a Japanese cloisonné circular dish, Meiji period, decorated with a sparrow amidst peony on a green ground, diameter 30.5cm.

Condition Report

1112. Jar in generally good condition with no significant damage or repairs, other than a drilled hole through base for the gilt metal mount. Typical light surface scratches and wear and some wires feel slightly raised to the touch when you run your hand over the body. Some minor stress hairlines in manufacture, but not obviously noticeable. Would benefit from a clean. Wood cover in good order.

Dish in generally good condition with no significant damage or repairs. Typical surface scratches and wear. Some typical minor pitting and some stress hairlines to turquoise ground. Footrim with dent, stress hairlines and some enamel loss.
