LOT 1575

Four pieces of Wemyss pottery painted with pink cabbage roses, circa 1900 and early 20th century, comprising a rectangular dressing table dish, inscribed 'No Rose Without a Thorn', 14.5cm by 9.5cm, a heart shaped inkstand and two covers, fitted with two glass wells, a two-handled cauldron, height 12.5cm, and a shell shaped inkstand, various painted, printed and impressed factory marks (restoration).

Estimate: £80 - £120

Condition Report

Rectangular dish - a couple of tiny nicks to decoration of one leaf, otherwise crazed.

Heart shaped inkstand - small area of chipping to the decoration on one side, overall crazing, one lid with some very noticeable black staining to the underside, one glass well with bruise and cracking to the base.

Cauldron - restoration to the rim in several places where the piece is hairline cracked, amateurly undertaken.

Overall crazing, very minor losses to the decoration, chipping to glaze on both handles.

Shell inkstand - the lid of the inkwell is extensively restored, is cracked and beginning to peel/chip. Overall crazing. Fault to the glazing beneath the lid of the inkwell on the main body of the inkstand.
