A large mixed group of mostly Stourbridge air trap satin glassware, late 19th century, including vases, jugs and baskets, predominantly with a quilted diamond design but also chevrons, trails and spots, in blue, pink, yellow and caramel colours, height of tallest pair 27cm (some faults).

### Condition Report

Squat yellow chevron pattern vase with bruise to side.

Orange chevron pattern jug with tiny dig to side of body.

Large pink basket with small chip to foot.

Pink chevron pattern jug with crack to upper handle terminal, small chips to lower handle terminal and bruise to body.

Pink chevron pattern vase with reduced neck and bruise to body.

Tall pair of pink baluster vases, one has small bruise to exterior.

Remaining items in lot in good condition overall with some typical light surface scratches/wear commensurate with age and use.
