A matched pair of Dresden porcelain Meissen style salts, early 20th century, the oval dish tops painted with stags beneath gilt dentil rims, raised on scroll and rococo moulded waisted feet, painted to the exterior with scattered flowers and insects, pseudo crossed swords marks in underglaze blue to bases, height 6cm (minor faults).

Estimate: £40 - £60

Condition Report

Salt with seated deer - small chip to exterior edge of foot by the lower terminal of one of the curls on the foot, an attempt has been made to disguise it with gold paint, noticeable as a notch to the underside. Otherwise in good condition overall with some typical light wear to the top gilt rim edge.

Salt with standing deer - typical light rubbing to gilding, otherwise ok.
