LOT 1968

A pair of diamond air trap satin glass vases, probably Stourbridge, late 19th century, the orange bodies enamelled in white, silvered and gilt with opposing birds surrounded by blossom, the cylindrical necks with frill rims, height 17.5cm, together with a small group of similar enamelled and gilt air trap satin glass, including a shaded pink example in the style of Jules Barbe for Thomas Webb, height 16cm, and a Continental cranberry example with birds and a butterfly around a floral display, height 25cm (some wear). Provenance: from the collection of John and Poppy Stallebrass.

Estimate: £120 - £180

Condition Report

Orange pair - one of the pair has an impact bruise to the body beside the main decoration.

Continental vase - typical wear and a few light surface scratches.

Shaded apricot vase - wear to decoration.

White vase - gilding on top rim edge totally worn, other decoration with varying degrees of wear to gilding.

Shortest pink vase - a number of light surface scratches.

Yellow vase - approx 1.5cm long haircrack to neck rim.

Remaining items in lot in generally good condition.
