LOT 1547

A Worcester porcelain Fence pattern underglaze blue printed circular bowl, hatched crescent mark in underglaze blue to base, diameter 16cm, together with a small group of similar wares, comprising four Fence pattern teabowls and saucers, a Three Flowers pattern spittoon, a Fisherman and Cormorant pattern sucrier and cover (restored) and a cobalt blue and gilt decorated wrythen moulded teacup and saucer.

Estimate: £70 - £100

Condition Report

Fence bowl - in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration. There is a 'blob' of glaze to the rim interior - a manufacturing issue.

Fence teabowls - one with 1cm vertical haircrack to top rim edge, and a couple of minuscule nicks alongside. One with very heavy scratches to the interior which are slightly discoloured. Otherwise all ok.

Fence saucers - one with minuscule nick to rim, one with small curved haircrack to rim. Otherwise all ok with typical light surface scratches.

Spittoon - approx 3.5cm long haircrack to base, small chip to outer edge of foot. Heavily scratched glaze overall, particularly to rim. The print is somewhat blurry particularly on the rim.

Sucrier - poorly restored chip to rim interior and small chip to upper rim edge, cover with poorly restored section to rim edge, chip to rim edge and poorly restored flower finial.

Teacup and saucer - saucer with starcrack to base and three haircracks to rim Vertical haircrack to cup which displays crazing. Some wear.
