LOT 1850

A pair of pale amber tinted crackle or ice glass vases, probably French, early 20th century, of rectangular shape with cranberry and gilt striated detail, flanked by lion mask handles, unmarked, height 25.5cm (faults), together with a pair of dark glass vases with a fine crackled petrol blue iridescent surface, height 26cm, and a matching smaller example, height 23cm. Provenance: from the collection of John and Poppy Stallebrass.

Estimate: £70 - £100

Condition Report

First of pair - both lion mask handles missing long 'tongue' section, approx 4cm long. There is one small chip to the top neck rim exterior and a few minor nibbles which are only really noticeable on close inspection.

Second of pair - one lion mask handle missing 'tongue', approx 1cm square flat chip to top rim edge of neck, the neck also has a large vertical crack. Large 'H' shaped crack to one side of body.

Dark pair - one with tiny nick to neck rim exterior, other with small chip to neck rim interior. Generally in good condition.

Single dark example - a few teeny tiny flea bites to neck rim exterior, only noticeable on very close inspection. In good condition overall.
