A small group of Chinese porcelain, 18th century and later, including a famille rose saucer, Qianlong period, painted in the Mandarin palette with figures, diameter 13.7cm, a famille rose quatrelobed oval dish, the exterior painted with figures, length 18.7cm, and a Canton famille rose vase of square tapering form, painted with opposing figural and precious objects panels, height 18.5cm (minor rim restoration).

Estimate: £50 - £80

Condition Report

1088. Saucer - good condition, no chips, cracks or repairs. Some wear to enamels.

Lobed dish - good condition, no chips, cracks or repairs. Good vibrant colours.

Canton vase - body of vase is in generally good condition with bright vibrant enamels. Typical light surface scratches and wear, more pronounced on gilt mask handles. Rim has restoration to one corner with the overpainting spreading around two sides of the rim.

Two Kangxi blue and white vases - in poor condition, both with extensive rim damage and loss. Taller vase has glaze fritting/loss to footrim and band above foot. The other with a 2.7cm long section of footrim broken out and reglued.
