A Chinese Dowager Empress Cixi style porcelain crocus or tulip vase, late 19th century, the quatrelobed body and narrow neck painted and gilt with dragons amidst peony on a turquoise ground, the pink lotus moulded mouth above a pink collar with five circular apertures, height 25.5cm (minor faults).

Estimate: £300 - £500

Condition Report

1060. Generally good condition with no significant damage or repairs. Typical light surface scratches and some wear to glaze and enamels, particularly to lobed body. Colours are otherwise good and vibrant. Few minor chips to edges of apertures. Minor chip to inside rim of the lotus mouth, but not significant. It also sounds like there is a hairline somewhere on the neck when tapping it, but cannot see it with UV light or the naked eye (might be from a firing crack where mouth meets neck).
