LOT 1093

A group of four Chinese porcelain shaped dishes, late Qing dynasty, comprising two pairs, each with turquoise glazed interior, one side painted with a pair of goldfish amidst weeds, the other side with lotus and leafy tendrils on a blue ground, indistinct seal mark to bases, lengths 18.2cm and 20cm (one repaired).

Estimate: £40 - £60

Condition Report

1093. Wear to gilt rims on all four.

Crescent dish 1 - large section of rim broken out in six pieces and re-glued. Chips/losses along break lines and large chip to footrim. Crazed and discoloured, scratches and wear.

Crescent dish 2 - generally good condition, no significant damage or repairs. Small chip to rim, typical surface scratches and wear to enamels. Some crazing and discolouration to glaze.

Cut cornered dish 1 - generally good condition, no significant damage or repairs. No cracks or chips, no restoration. Typical surface scratches and wear to enamels and glaze. Turquoise interior slightly misfired to base of interior, so glaze a bit uneven/rough.

Cut cornered dish 2 - generally good condition, no significant damage or repairs, no chips, cracks or restoration. Turquoise interior glaze a little lighter/faded than others in comparison. Typical surface scratches and wear to glaze and enamels.
