LOT 1101

A group of Chinese export porcelain teaware, 18th century, mostly Qianlong period, comprising a pair of armorial teacups, each exterior painted and gilt with a coat of arms and monogram beneath bellflower festoons, height 4.5cm, a yellow glazed chrysanthemum moulded teabowl with turquoise interior and branch moulded base, diameter 7.3cm, two teabowls and saucers, two famille rose saucers and a jug, height 13.5cm (some hairline cracks).

Condition Report

1101. Pair of armorial cups - both cups in generally good condition with no chips, cracks or repairs. Typical light surface scratches and wear to glaze, gilt and enamels.

Yellow chrysanthemum bowl - generally good condition with no significant damage or repairs. Minor chip to leaf on side. Otherwise typical light surface scratches and wear to enamels and gilt.

Dog teabowl and saucer - saucer with 3cm hairline to rim, bowl with 5cm and 3cm hairlines to rim. Both with typical surface wear and scratches to enamels.

Jug - good condition, no chips, cracks or repairs. Typical wear to gilt and enamels.

Landscape teabowl & saucer - faint 2cm hairline to rim of saucer, otherwise both pieces in good order, typical light wear to enamels, gilt and glaze.

Saucer 1 - generally good condition, some wear and surface scratches to enamels and glaze. Few minor glaze blemishes to rim.

Saucer 2 (iron red border) - generally good condition, a couple of minor chips to rim and typical light surface scratches and wear to gilt and enamels.

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
