Cylindrical pierced mustard - generally good condition, no significant damage or repairs. Typical light surface scratches and wear. Lid with some wear to engraving, but hinge is good and closes tightly. Good clear hallmarks. Glass liner in good order and fits well.

Both sit nice and flat. Both spoons in generally good order.
