A George III silver oval mustard with domed hinged lid and pierced thumbpiece above pierced and engraved sides between reeded rims, London 1799 by Peter & Ann Bateman, height 7.9cm, a silver oval mustard with domed hinged lid and urn finial above engraved sides, London 1799 by Charles Chesterman II, height 9.3cm, and two silver Fiddle pattern mustard spoons, London 1852 and 1858, total weight 252g.

369. Bateman mustard - good condition with no significant damage or repairs. Good crisp decoration. Hinge in good order and lid closes tightly. Good clear hallmarks. Glass liner a good fit and in good condition.

Chesterman mustard - generally good condition. Minor dent to body and engraved monogram to side. Otherwise no significant damage or repairs. Typical light surface scratches and wear. Hinge is good and closes tightly. Good clear hallmarks. Glass liner a good fit and in good condition.

Both mustards sit nice and flat with no wobble.

Both spoons in good order, engraved with monograms.
