A George III silver shaped oval mustard, the engraved hinged lid with urn finial above engraved sides, London 1788 by Benjamin Montigue, height 9cm, and a later similar silver mustard with pierced and engraved decoration, London 1911 by C.S. Harris & Sons Ltd, height 8.2cm, together with a silver Fiddle and Shell pattern mustard spoon, Edinburgh 1833, and a silver Fiddle pattern mustard spoon, London 1789, total weight 253.8g.

Condition Report

370. George III mustard - generally good condition, no significant damage or repairs. Typical light surface scratches and wear. Hinge is good and closes tightly. Some typical minor dints/nicks to body. Hallmarks slightly rubbed, but still readable. Glass liner in good order and fits well.

Later mustard - in good condition with typical light surface scratches and wear. Hinge is good with minor play and lid closes tightly. Good clear hallmarks. Glass liner fits well and in good condition.

Both mustards sit flat with no wobble.

Both spoons in good order, one with engraved initial.
