A Victorian silver baluster mustard, the hinged lid with spiral finial above floral and scroll chased decoration, flanked by a cast foliate handle, on a similarly decorated circular foot, Birmingham 1866 by Ellis & Co, height 9.5cm, and a George III silver oval mustard with pierced and engraved sides, London 1798 by Crispin Fuller, height 8.7cm, together with two silver Fiddle pattern mustard spoons, London 1828 and 1874, total weight 338g.

Condition Report

359. Baluster mustard - good clean condition, with no significant damage or repairs. Typical light surface scratches. Sits nice and flat with good crisp decoration. Hinge is good and lid closes tightly. Glass liner in good order and fits well. Good clear hallmarks.

Oval mustard - generally good condition, no significant damage or repairs. Slight misshaping to front bottom edge of mustard. Decoration is good. Hinge is good and lid closes well, but gapes ever so slightly. Glass liner fits well and is in good order. Good clear hallmarks.

Both mustards sit nice and flat with no wobbles.

Both spoons in generally good condition, one monogram engraved.
