### LOT 360

An early Victorian silver octagonal mustard, the engraved hinged lid with pierced heart shaped thumbpiece above scroll pierced sides, London 1841 by Edward Farrell, height 7.3cm, and a silver cylindrical mustard with domed hinged lid and knob finial, above pierced sides, on a cast scroll foot, London 1844 by George Frederick Pinnell, height 8.4cm, together with two silver Fiddle pattern mustard spoons, London 1853 and 1867, total weight 272.7g.

### Condition Report

360. Octagonal mustard - generally good condition, piercing to body in good order. Hinge is slightly wobbly with some lateral movement, wear to engraving on lid and finial repaired. Good clear hallmarks. Glass liner in good order and fits well.

Cylindrical mustard - generally good condition, pierced body in good order, hinge is good and closes tightly. Hallmarks are good and clear. Glass liner fits well and in good order.

Both mustards sit nice and flat with no wobbles.

Both spoons in generally good order. Good clear marks, one monogram engraved.
