### LOT 365

An early Victorian silver cylindrical mustard with crest engraved domed hinged lid and pierced thumbpiece above scroll pierced sides, on a lobed circular foot, London 1842 by Edward, Edward jnr, John & William Barnard, height 8.3cm, and a similar silver mustard with ball finial, London 1861 by Alfred Ivory, height 7.5cm, together with two silver Fiddle pattern mustard spoons, Exeter 1871 and London 1884, total weight 327.1g.

### Condition Report

365. Cylindrical mustard with shaped foot - good condition with no significant damage or repairs. Typical light surface scratches and wear. Hinge lid with wear to engraved crest, otherwise slight lateral play to hinge and closes tightly. Good clear hallmarks. Glass liner in good order and fits tightly.

Other cylindrical mustard with ball finial - good condition with no significant damage or repairs. Typical light surface scratches and wear. Hinge is good with only minor lateral play, lid closes tightly. Good clear hallmarks. Glass liner fits well and is in good order.

Both mustards sit nice and flat with no wobbles.

Two spoons in good order.
