### LOT 1538

A pair of Coalport porcelain soup plates, circa 1820, well-painted with dense floral panels within a richly gilt border, unmarked, diameter 21cm, together with a cabinet plate, probably Coalport, painted in the French taste with a mother bird and two fledglings within a gilt and blue enamelled border, unmarked, diameter 24cm, and a cobalt blue ground gilt overlaid stand, probably Derby, painted to the centre with a landscape view including a folly, unmarked, diameter 19.5cm.

Estimate: £70 - £100

### Condition Report

Pair plates - first in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration. The second, when viewed from the back, is crazed with some staining and some minor chips to the footrim.

Bird plate - in good condition overall with typical light rubbing to the gilding, no cracks, chips or restoration.

Stand - gilding worn to rim edge and inner cavetto, when viewed under a strong light the surface overall is heavily scratched.
