LOT 1506

Three pieces of Doulton Lambeth stoneware, late 19th century, comprising an Askos shaped jug with applied foliate roundels and beaded decoration, by Eliza L. Hubert, height 17.8cm, a jug decorated with scrolling foliage by Frank A. Butler (restored), and a vase applied with portraits, together with a Royal Doulton natural foliage ware vase.

Estimate: £60 - £100

Condition Report

Askos jug - the lower section of the handle has professional restoration. A few of the tiny pinhead sized 'beads' have surface scuffs/nicks, only noticeable on close inspection.

Butler jug - the whole of the front section of the jug beneath the spout has been broken away in an oval shape and visibly poorly restored back into place, with associated similar restoration to the front of the neck and spout - the repainting is very poorly executed.

Vase with portraits - the oval female portrait has restoration to its lower third, otherwise the vase is in good condition.

Natural Foliage vase - there is a vertical haircrack running from the neck rim almost to the footrim of the vase.
