Two Stuart & Sons glass vases, early 20th century, each clear body with a trailed green spiral, the first of bulbous shape with crimped rim, height 8cm, the second of conical shape with flared crimped rim, height 11cm, together with a mixed group of similar Arts and Crafts type glass, including a pair of sweetmeat dishes with wrythen moulded clear bowls and green edged rims, raised on root type feet, in the style of John Walsh Walsh, height 8cm, a pair of footed clear vases with green line decoration edged with clear detail, possibly Stevens & Williams, height 30cm, an olive green jug in the style of Sowerby art glass and a milky opaline vase with green trailed decoration, height 34cm. Provenance: from the collection of John and Poppy Stallebrass.

Estimate: £120 - £180

Condition Report

The clear cylindrical vase with lime green trailed decoration has significant losses to the trailing around the foot and less so to the lower body, predominantly.

The dark green flared trumpet vase with pulled spiralling decoration to the exterior is missing the very end tip of the exterior decoration - only noticeable on very close inspection.

Otherwise each item in the lot is in good condition with no damage or repairs.
