LOT 1924

An engraved glass tea caddy and cover and matching glass, probably Russian, late 19th century, the caddy of square shape, engraved with flowers to three sides and an entwined monogram to the fourth, the glass with the same monogram, height of caddy 14cm, together with a small group of other glass, comprising a Stuart limited edition 1937 Coronation commemorative tankard produced for Thomas Goode & Co Ltd, with coin base, height 15cm, a pair of frosted and clear cut glass goblets, probably Richardsons, height 18.8cm, a similar pair of bud vases, height 20.5cm, and a Powell type amethyst tinted trumpet vase with twisted stem, engraved with grasses, height 25cm. Provenance: the caddy and tankard from Brian Watson Antique Glass. Prior to this the caddy was with A La Vieille Russie.

Estimate: £70 - £100

Condition Report

Two of the base corners of the caddy have small grazes/nicks which have possibly been minimally polished, the caddy has a number of small nicks to the inner and outer circumference of the top rim where the cover sits - these are not unsightly. The cover of the caddy has chipping to the whole inner and outer circumference of its base edge, not visible when in position. The cover does fit well but sits slightly at an angle when in position, perhaps suggesting a marriage?

The other items in the lot are in good condition overall with no damage or repairs.
