### LOT 1495

A Worcester Precipice pattern blue painted circular bowl, circa 1770, blue painted open crescent mark to base, diameter 21cm, together with a Chinese blue and white porcelain bowl, mark of Kangxi but late 19th century, the exterior painted with figures in a garden, the interior with blossoming rockwork, underglaze blue four-character mark to base, diameter 22.5cm (cracked and chipped), with two hardwood stands.

### Condition Report

Worcester - the bowl rings nicely when tapped, in good condition overall with no cracks, chips or restoration. There is a small dark patch to the outer edge of the footrim, a manufacturing issue - please see image 5 on our website using the zoom function. The glaze to the bowl interior is heavily scratched but the decoration is not affected.

Chinese - rings nicely when tapped. There is an approx 7cm long vertical crack to the rim which does not go through the decoration, please see image 10 on our website using the zoom function. There are 2 small chips to the top rim edge and a number of fritted nicks to the top rim edge.

Both wood stands are in good condition.
