A Carstons Tonnieshof West German pottery vase, mid-20th century, of square shape, each face with four moulded textured panels glazed in alternate mottled brown and orange/red, moulded marks to base, height 36cm, together with a group of other West German pottery, mid and second half 20th century, including two floor vases, tallest 51cm, jugs and other vases, with examples by Bay Keramik and Scheurich.

Estimate: £100 - £150

Condition Report

The square shaped vase has 6 small glaze chips/nicks to the relief orange panels.

The erupted glaze vase with orange and red animals has a small chip to the base edge of the footrim.

One of the 'C' shaped vases has a small chip to its side edge.

The tallest pitcher with red flowers has a small chip to its inner rim edge.

The middle sized vase with erupted glaze and orange chevrons has a vertical crack to the rim.

Cream ground vase with brown and green stylized leaves has minor nicks to the top rim edge.

Otherwise the items in the lot are generally in good condition.
