A Staffordshire Pearl pottery part dessert service, late 19th century, decorated with floral bouquets against a turquoise ground within gilt edged cobalt blue scroll frames, comprising a two-handled footed centrepiece, a pair of two-handled square shaped dishes, a two-handled rectangular dish, four circular two-handled dishes and seventeen plates, together with a set of six Vesper soup plates and a Spode's New Fayence floral decorated part dessert service (some faults).

Condition Report

PLEASE NOTE THIS IS A PARTIAL CONDITION REPORT ON THIS LOT JUST DETAILING THE PEARL SERVICE

Overall the service has typical crazing to the glaze and varying degrees of loss/flaking to the enamelled turquoise ground.

12 of the plates are generally ok.

The centrepiece is fundamentally ok but does have considerable losses to the turquoise.

One of the square dishes has a riveted repair to one handle, the other square dish is generally ok.

Rectangular dish is ok.

The four circular dishes are ok apart from the fact one has more enamel loss than the others.
