Condition Report

395. Generally good clean condition with no significant damage or repairs. Engine turning is good and crisp, vacant cartouche with no erasures or engraving. No dents, splits or deep scratches. Top rim slightly misshapen and bottom with very slight misshaping. Handle good and sits flat. Good clear hallmarks. Leather case ok, but one hinge detached.
