A Chinese archaistic jade vase, Qing dynasty, the ovoid body and flared narrow neck carved in low relief with bands of taotie and lappets, flanked by a pair of foliate scroll handles, the stone of celadon tone with darker brown and black inclusions, height 11.5cm.

## **Condition Report**

1070. Generally the vase is in good condition with no significant damage or repairs. Few very minor nicks to handles, but nothing significant. There are hairline inclusions running diagonally down from the neck and vertically through the body and foot, which can be seen clearly in the images on our website. Colour is a celadon green with some darker brown and dark brown/black areas. Carving is good and crisp.
